Dear Friends,

Some of the names listed above are new colleagues to me from NEGA Presbytery. Since my first conversation with Presbytery leaders Rev. Hilary Shuford and Rev. Ed Rees, I have been warmly welcomed here. As you know within days of moving to Augusta, Andy's mom died in Athens. While we were standing in line at the visitation, I thought I recognized the woman in front of me as someone I'd seen on a Zoom screen but never met in person. When she introduced herself as our new General Presbyter, Hilary Shuford, we were touched. I said, "It means so much that you would come. We've never even met." She smiled and said, "Yes, but we are family now. Welcome to the Presbytery." I am grateful for the new colleagues who will be leading us in worship. I am also grateful for those I have known for a very long time. Here is a little bit about how each of them have come to be part of this day.

In the summer of 1998, I served as a ministry intern at First Presbyterian Church in Asheville, NC. Dr. Pete Peery was my supervisor. In the many years since he has been a mentor and friend to me in ministry. I am grateful that he will be preaching.

In the fall of 1998, I met my husband Andy at Columbia Seminary. We married in 2000 and since then we have been what the church calls a "clergy couple." I am grateful that he will be leading us in worship.

In December of 2006, God called me to serve as Pastor of the good people of First Presbyerian Church in Greer. When I went to

Greer I had no idea what I was doing. I had never preached every week, moderated a Session meeting, or led a staff. That church loved me into being a Pastor. Elder Jeff Smith was Clerk of the Session when I arrived there and to say that I have learned a thing or two from him over the years would be a serious understatement. I am grateful and a little afraid that he will be giving the Charge to the Pastor.

On September 15th, 2021 I received my first email from Elder Woody Belangia. It said, "As you may know, we are looking for a Pastor / Head of Staff for our church and your PIF caught our eye. Your experience, pulpit skills, leadership, heart, and obvious love for Christ makes you the kind of person we would want to lead our church." The rest, as they say, is history. I'm grateful to the Pastor Nominating Committee: Ed Boland, Woody Belangia, Jay Markwalter, Kathryn McLeod, Denise Rosenzweig, Anna Sanders, and Cheryl Wilson for their faithful service on the PNC and for their part in calling me to serve as your Pastor. Thank you, in advance, to Woody for offering the Charge to the Congregation.

Our Book of Order reminds us that, "In Baptism each Christian is called to ministry in Christ's name. God calls some persons from the midst of congregations to fulfill particular functions, so that the ministry of the whole people of God may flourish. In ordination the church sets apart with prayer and the laying on of hands those who have been called by God through the voice of the church to serve as deacons, ruling elders, and ministers of the Word and Sacrament⁺. In installation the church sets in place with prayer those who have been (previously) ordained and are now called anew to service in that ministry."

It is an honor and a great joy to be called anew to serve as the Pastor of Reid Memorial Presbyterian Church. I do so hope you'll join us for worship to give God thanks and praise for bringing us all together.

They set to work painting in duos and trios while humming and singing along to music, telling jokes and sharing in fun conversation. We received wonderful feedback about our Youth. "They worked hard; they were respectful, and you can tell they enjoyed being around one another. They did a great job."

In April, Reid Youth had two opportunities for service. On a Thursday afternoon, they helped set up tents and tables, and offered a free hotdog meal to all that came to Harrisburg's first Veggie Market of the season. The youth had a great time serving young and old, engaging in conversation with our neighbors that live in Harrisburg and members of Reid Memorial that stopped by, and wandering the Veggie Market, sampling local honey, and visiting with Walter, the Goat.

Finally, our Reid Youth served at Thornwell Children's Home Strawberry Festival. Along with 3 adults, the Youth worked concessions, visited with children and visitors, ate their fill of strawberries, and learned more about Thornwell. Similar to our work day with Turn Back the Block, our Reid Youth are always complimented for their work ethic, their ability to have fun in any environment, and compassion and kindness that they show to the people that surround them.


