# Reflecting on a Season of Wonder

This was our Advent and Christmas theme for 2022, and hopefully, some part of the services, Sunday school classes, or music concerts brought a moment of pure wonder for you and transported you to a holy moment. I have a particular heart for the arts in all their various forms and I hope that by making that our lens, you also saw something with fresh eyes, from a new perspective, or perhaps even in a totally different and inspiring light.

The music soaring into the high arches of the church was enough to thrill the ears and charge the heart, and when Lucy Baum came to paint Mary and Elizabeth throughout our service December 18, we watched with eagerness as each stroke added to the story and proclaimed a new word of joy over their greeting of one another, both with child.

In Sunday school we looked at art work, composers Bach and Mozart, learned about the art of mending broken pottery, and felt the work of poets as their words washed through us.

We prayed a prayer made up of your words, written on small white cards and collected. A prayer of hope, of wonder, and truly your prayer as the community of believers here at Reid Memorial. You, too, are artists. Blue Christmas brought us into a space to reflect in silent wonder at the depth of feeling we are capable of, even when it hurts, and the ways in which God speaks into those wounds to bring comfort and presence and soothe our pain.







Our table displayed a representation of Starry Night by Van Gogh, a reminder that even an artistic genius is not immune to mental illness and the sufferings of the world. Together these opportunities brought artists into our midst in a variety of ways.

In the coming year, I hope to continue to bring art into conversation with faith. With the generosity of our neighbors across the way, we will be able to engage with the St. John's Bible. This project was a huge undertaking and 15-year work of passion for calligraphers, theologians, and other artists. The result is a remarkable Bible meant for sharing in community. Keep your ears open for offerings around this marvelous work of faith and art!



She studies the cultural stories we tell ourselves about success, suffering, and whether (or not) we're capable of change. Kate hosts the Everything Happens podcast where, in warm, insightful, often funny conversations, she talks with people like Malcolm Gladwell and Anne Lamott about what they've learned in difficult times. She lives in Durham, NC, with her family and continues to teach do-gooders at Duke Divinity School.

It's almost unfathomable that we find ourselves in the midst of the Lenten season. I've always been fascinated with the Christian calendar. In particular the parallels between our two major seasons of Lent and Advent. Both seasons have a great many traditions and customs associated with each. In both seasons, we find ourselves waiting with anticipation for a day, an event, a happening. Lastly, both seasons include a set of hymns, songs, and spiritual songs that call our minds to the nature of the occasion. Lent is a time that we are to reflect, to meditate and contemplate, to fast and abstain.

As a church musician, I have always found myself on the frazzled side around the Lenten/Easter season (as well as Advent/Christmas season) and look for ways to stay grounded and focused on the reason behind the things that we do at this time of year. I find myself each week truly reflecting on the text of the hymns...

Upon the cross of Jesus mine eye at times can see.
The very dying form of One who suffered there for me:
And from my stricken heart with tears two wonders I confess;
The wonders of redeeming love and my unworthiness.

How easy it is to allow the many distractions to keep our minds off what we should be contemplating and studying on, and trained on things that fill our calendars, cost us money and energy, and in the grand scheme, do nothing to advance the heavenly calling given to us while on this Earth.

This year, as Masters Sunday falls on Easter, we have a wonderful opportunity to welcome visitors! Reid Memorial has several opportunities for worship Holy week beginning with our Palm Sunday service, Maundy Thursday service, followed by the community Good Friday service hosted here at Reid Memorial, and all culminating with us eagerly exclaiming the tomb is empty and joyfully proclaiming that Christ is indeed risen!

We pray that you will take part with us in reaching out in this mission of hospitality to those visiting Augusta during Masters this year. I think we worship at a pretty great place, and I am excited to share in worship with all those with us this Easter.

He also studied organ with Preston Rockholt and John Schaeffer. Dr. Lord joined the staff of Reid Memorial Presbyterian Church in November of 2021 as Associate Director of Music & Organist.
